Sudden departure of the project's field co-ordinator has led to a delay in all 'human ecological' research, especially NTFP use and trade. This research is expected to be conducted in the third quarter of this year.

- 3. Are there any other issues you wish to raise relating to the project or to Darwin's management, monitoring, or financial procedures.
 - This initial Darwin grant has been successful in levering larger funding from the European Commission. In the third quarter of this year, FFI and our current partner, the Forest Protection Department, intended to implement a c. US \$ 750,000 expanded project for the wider Hoang Lien Mountains. The Darwin grant will co-finance the EC-funded phase of project development, and the expanded project will build upon the vision and objectives of the current Darwin-funded project.
