These achievements are in line with the Key Milestones, with the exception of the exhibition of the biodiversity displays.

As the Biodiversity Interpretation Centre has now been completed the biodiversity interpretation displays will be exhibited and the British Ambassador, Hanoi, will conduct the official opening. As reported in previous documents the fall through of the building from FIPI, led to application of funds to build the centre and once funds were secured from the FCO's Environmental Project Fund, the task of obtaining permissions and contracting builders through the Vietnamese bureaucratic system was mounted. To compare with other organisations that have built, centres and displays, the project has shown time efficiency for Vietnam. No changes to the original agreement have been made over the last 6 months.
