To date Milestones 1 and 2 have been successfully completed. Our candidate Saoud Motala was successful in gaining a place on the MSc in Advanced Methods in Taxonomy and Biodiversity at Imperial College & The Natural History Museum. Saoud arrived in the UK at the beginning of October at the start of the project and commenced his MSc on the 6 October. We have a project planning meeting scheduled on the 12 November with staff in the Entomology Group at the NHM to discuss the training needs of Saoud and identify strategy for his thesis. The thesis will be undertaken using material collected during the preliminary phase of the project, probably studying the taxonomy of endemic dung beetles found in Mauritius, samples of which were collected during the preliminary phase of the study.
