8-9 May: pre-project meeting in Zapotillo, Ecuador with BirdLife and NCI representatives.

20-21 May: pre-project meeting in Loja, Ecuador with project team.

7-8 June: pre-project meeting in Loja with project team.

22-23 July: meetings in Lima with CONAM, CDC, British Embassy and Natural History Museum

26-28 July: initial GIS and Db training in Loja (to be complemented by fuller training in Nov).

29-30 July: meetings in Quito with Ministry of Environment, BirdLife and British Embassy.

2-3 Aug: meeting in Guayaquil, Ecuador with project partner ProBosque.

22-25 Aug: team meeting Guayaquil and purchase of project equipment.

9-11 Sept: team meeting in Sullana, Peru.

13-14 Sept: meetings in Lima with CONAM, CAN, British Embassy, CESA, Natural History Museum, PNUD & UDEP.

Overall, the above meetings have served to:

- Consolidate working relationships between BirdLife and local partners, and between the local partners themselves in the three project offices in Loja, Guayaquil (Ecuador) and Sullana (Peru).
- Publicize the project with local and national authorities. Project is currently working towards a three-way working agreement between BirdLife, the Ecuadorian Ministry of Environment and the Peruvian National Environment Council (CONAM). Additional agreements are expected with other institutions in the coming months.

Meetings have assisted the on-going development of DarwinNet, additionally the project is advancing with species action plans, virtual library and fact-sheets on conservation, as well as constant communications with partners and other parties.

Project is applying to present a poster at the tenth meeting of SBSTTA, in Bangkok, February 2005, under the theme of "Working together for biodiversity: regional and international initiatives contributing to achieving and measuring progress towards the 2010 target".
