1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

Project activities during this reporting period, which corresponds to the austral winter, focussed on capacity building of park guides and creating interpretation posters for the new visitor centre. A 7-day training course was held in the park's office for the 27 guides to improve English and French speaking skills. This was a follow-up to the less intensive course during May 2006 and was requested by our host country partners. The training course also included lessons on etiquette when working with tourists and included assessed guided walks in the forest. Project biologists accompanied the training team and conducted a rodent survey and the annual bat count in 16 caves. We created and produced five (lemurs, birds, reptiles, amphibians, bats and carnivores & rodents), large colour posters for installation in the park's new visitor centre. Darwin trainees continued to write up their research theses and team members had a publication accepted in the journal Oryx. We held a workshop in collaboration with our host country partners and the Ministry of Education and Scientific Research to evaluate a teachers' module that we prepared for primary schools.
