1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

All work in Sabah for this project has now finished, all specimens collected during this work have now been sent to Kew (about 3000 specimens). Several projects are underway which will build on the work started by this project. The main one is the project proposal to establish a 50 hectare plot at Danum. This project is lead by the University of Aberdeen and will build on the plant identification expertise build up during this Darwin supported project. The expanded herbarium at Danum and the improved links with Sandakan and Kew herbaria will also become a major resource for this new project. Almost all of the core people trained during this project (5 people) are still in place (one person has taken up a position at the Forestry Department at Sandakan). Other people trained during this project are generally still in their positions, for instance the c. 10 people working in the Sandakan herbarium trained during this project are still active in research in the herbarium. However contact has been lost with many of the other participants from various different organisations.

In the UK, the writing up for the field guide has started and 80 most common families have now been done (see appendix 1 for a sample page), a further 20 families will be done before 1 January 2009 and then sent for final editing. Negotiations are underway between Kew Publishing and Natural History Publications (Borneo) about publishing and distribution of the book. Natural History Publications (Borneo) has the best distribution network in Sabah and possibly the whole of Malaysia, and this will ensure that it will reach the right people and for an affordable price.

The habitat assessment and Forest Certification part of the project has now been finished ahead of planning (as explained in the first year report) and the final report from ProForest has been submitted to Yayasan Sabah and Darwin. The HVCF identification part of the report is becoming the standard for HVCF work in both Sabah and Sarawak and requests for information have been received from various organisations (government, NGO and commercial).

No notable problems have occurred in the last 6 months. Apart from asking due to fieldwork commitments for a different project, to submit this report 2 weeks after the due date. This permission was given.
