1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

Progress over the first 6 months of the third year of this project has bee good and everything is on schedule and within budget.

- In April David Rae visited NGBB to arrange final planning for the third year and discuss project details with Prof. Dr Adil Guner.
- In June two staff from RBGE visited NGBB to undertake *ex situ* and conservation technique and horticultural work.
- Also in June two staff from NGBB visited RBGE for horticultural, database and education training and experience. This had originally been planned as two people for five weeks but for a variety of reasons we decided that it would be better to split this visit and have two for two weeks in June and then another two staff for the remaining three weeks later.
- In October the additional two staff from NGBB visited RBGE for the remaining three weeks. Additional funding was sought externally to invite a further horticulturist from NGBB for this visit, so in the end, three of them visited for three weeks.
- In addition, and completely separate from the Darwin project (but it was very much complimentary) we found external funds to bring three young Turkish botanical artists to Edinburgh for three weeks for botanical art training.
- For logistical reasons the timing of the Interpretation workshop and CBD workshop were switched. This was done simply to suit personal diaries and the timetable of events at NGBB. Timing of these workshops was not critical so long as they took place within the year. The CBD workshop took place at NGBB in October and was highly successful. David Rae and Mary Gibby (Director of Science) from RBGE took part along with Prof Vernon Heywood and Joachim Gratzfeld from BGCI. Additional funds from Edinburgh and NGBB were found to invite Joachim Gratzfeld. Over 30 delegates from Turkey took

part including invitees from the Agriculture, Environment and Forestry Departments.

• The only remaining element of this project is the Interpretation workshop which is now due to take place in February.
