1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

The project original project timetable finished on 31st March 2009; we are currently working on completing publications and data-basing and securing project legacy with a new project finish date of 31st March 2010.

The laminated illustrated guide to the land snails of the Western Ghats, India is in press and should be available by mid-November. The laminated guide to Nepalese snails is nearing completion. The Indian and Nepalese illustrated lists are being made ready for inclusion on our web pages and as hard copy publications.

We are continuing to work with our Thai partners in preparing taxonomic revisionary studies for publication in international journals and on providing extensive project coverage at the 2010 World Congress of Malacology <u>http://www.wcm2010.com/symposium.asp</u>.

Visits

Our Indian and Nepalese project partners were hosted at the Natural History Museum from 3rd June to 8th July 2009 to carry out identifications of survey material and work on joint papers.

With additional support from the British Council we hosted five Malaysian project partners from Universiti Sains Malaysia at the Natural History Museum and the University of Nottingham from 8th to 22nd October.

Fred Naggs will be visiting ATREE, India, from 3rd to 22nd November on external funding.

Luong Van Hao, Department of National Parks, Vietnam will visit the NHM from 17th January 2010 to 4th March 2010 to work up our Vietnamese survey collections on a Natural History Museum Special Funds Award,.

MoUs

New MoUs are being negotiated with several project partners that will build on the momentum of the current Darwin project and extend to a wide range of activities. Fred Naggs is working with project partners to produce such MoUs with ATREE, India, and Universiti Sains Malaysia. Following the Vietnamese visit to London in February, a new MoU (copy attached) has been signed between the Natural History Museum, the Vietnamese National Museum of Nature and the Vietnamese Department of National Parks. As a direct result, several projects are being supported in the Natural History Museum's Zoology, and Entomology Departments.
