1. establishment of planning, management and accounting systems. This is complete, subject to some additional exchanges with colleagues in Timor to ensure transparency.

Jul-Sep

- 1. Consultation groups established (steering committee, working group, local advisory group) not possible under current circumstances, as this requires strong in-country presence.
- 2. Site directory drafted and circulated a complete draft has been prepared. It is not possible to circulate this in Timor, as the manager is not present to coordinate. There has been Timorese participation in the early stages of drafting, and we are committed to ensuring strong participation in the review process up to publication in 2007.
- 3. Gaps in information identified for surveys. Work to identify gaps has taken place, and formal proposals can be made in the next quarter. Input and validation from Timorese colleagues is needed before these can be used for planning joint surveys; not possible because of the absence of the project manager.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.

The project began on 1 May, but activities on the ground in Timor-Leste were suspended in mid May following severe political disturbances, which led to the evacuation of foreigners including project manager Cathy Molnar. In addition, visits from overseas specialists were not possible for security reasons. However, it was agreed with the Darwin secretariat that we should continue with as many activities as possible, and report on the period to 30 September (the present report).

We are keeping matters under close observation through email contact with colleagues in Timor-Leste. The most significant development is that Cathy Molnar is expected to resume her role as Project Manager on 6 November. Immediate needs will be to review the work-programme and budget, aiming to complete the project in the remaining available time. Despite the difficulties, we remain confident that we will be able to implement this project, because:

- the initiative to create a protected areas network is longstanding and still has full national support and ownership, which was unaffected by the disturbances; the new Prime Minister is equally or more strongly supportive of the programme that his predecessor.
- the international commitment to restoring normality in Timor is strong, giving good reason to expect that resumption of a full programme of activity in-country will be possible.
- the government team working on Protected Areas before the disturbances remains intact.
- However, some activities may need to be rescheduled or adjusted.

Have any of these issues been discussed with the Darwin Secretariat and if so, have changes been made to the original agreement?

Yes: following messages from BirdLife in June and July, it was agreed that the claim normally due 3 months from project commencement could be omitted, and our first report/claim would cover 1 May to 30 September. No other changes to the original agreement were made; it was accepted that some early milestones would be missed, but as explained above we expect to reschedule these.
