## 1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

**Visits:** Two scientists plus Darwin-funded staff member from Argentina visited Natural History Museum, London. Received training in GIS methods, studied NHM collections (Chironomidae and Ceratopogonidae), discussed databasing, and future project strategy.

**Collections:** Planning completed for forthcoming fieldwork season (Nov 2007-March 2008) in north of Nahel Huapi National Park. Proposed sites visited and mapped; Park Rangers briefed and logistical assistance agreed.

Most material collected during last year's field season stored, labelled and sorted to main taxonomic groups and many identified. Species lists compiled for major insect groups.

**Meetings:** with Department of Environmental Education of Parques Nacionales; participation in Congreso Latinoamericano de Parques Nacionales 30/09 – 06/10/2007

**Courses run under the Darwin Initiative banner:** Planning completed for a 3-day workshop on collecting and identifying freshwater invertebrates with teachers and school students (for 27, 28 and 29 November) and a similar course for over 20 fishermen (21, 22 and 23 November).

Postgraduate course at Esquel University on morphology and function of freshwater insects (17/09/07 to 26/09/07)

Post graduate course on chironomids at Mar del Plata University (16-20 July).

Organisation of postgraduate course on freshwater insects in Bariloche University.

Organisation of 3 days workshop for primary schools in Bariloche, in collaboration with Dept of Environmental Education of Parques Nacionales.

**Publications:** Taxonomic paper of Ceratopogonidae published in Transactions of the American Entomological Society

500 copies of introductory guide to Argentina freshwater invertebrates produced for use in schools

2000 copies of leaflets about aquatic insects from northern Patagonia. The product is part of a series of leaflets about regional fauna and flora that Parques Nacionales distribute to tourists within the park.

A web page dedicated to the project, to be hosted at La Plata Museum, is under development and is expected to be on line shortly.

Equipment: Digital imaging equipment installed

Using resources from the Darwin Initiative three laboratories are now fully equipped and are in regular use for freshwater biodiversity studies. One is situated in Bariloche under the auspices of Parques Nacionales, one is situated in La Plata Museum and a third is situated in the Estacion Biologica Puerto Blest.

**Education:** One Darwin-funded technical assistant beginning PhD thesis on Chironomidae based on material collected in this project; one Darwin-funded technical assistant completed undergraduate project based on Simuliidae collected in this project.
