1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

## Progress has been excellent in all project areas:

- Biodiversity surveys are being conducted throughout the watershed area within varying habitats. Results gained form these surveys have been both varied and interesting.
- An ecolodge has been established within the local area and a management team developed. Further work on marketing and managing this lodge as an ecotourism venture is still on going.
- Several alternative livelihoods projects have been established including piggeries, fish pond and rice milling. The local communities involved in these projects have received training in the required skills and monitoring and mentoring continues.
- The development of the eco forestry component is dependent on results gained from the biodiversity assessments which are still on going.
- The 'scholars' programme of training future natural resource managers has been developed with UniTech (University of Technology, Lae) with an undergraduate group attending a week long field course at the project area. The training programme includes learning and understanding the need for biodiversity assessment and monitoring in natural resource management.
- Training of local staff continues with the training of guides for ecotourism ventures and for assistance in educational courses.
- PR activities are ongoing with print media outputs, website updates and a local radio interview being completed. An update visit with various stakeholder activities was completed by Dr Craig Turner in August 2007.
