- Re-planting of the experimental plots has been the main field-based research activity during the reporting period. A further 10 plots (c. 10,000 seedlings) have been planted with a total of 25 plots now replanted (c. 25,000 seedlings).
- Project website for the Sabah Biodiversity Experiment launched (<u>www.sabahbiodiversityexperiment.net</u>). This is a general site for the experiment – but gives full credit to the Darwin Initiative.
- The first peer-reviewed publication resulting from the project published: Saner, P., Lim, R., Burla, B., Ong, R.C., Scherer-Lorenzen, M., Hector, A. 2009. Reduced soil respiration in gaps in logged lowland dipterocarp forests. *Forest Ecology & Management, 258, 2007-2012.*
- Major new associated research and training programme, funded by the Earthwatch Institute, launched in August 2009.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.

• Progress with replanting has been slightly slower than anticipated as a result of the El Nino event that, although relatively mild, resulted in lower than normal rainfall – and hence sporadically unfavourable planting conditions. With the return of wetter weather we hope to make up these delays over the next 6 months. This will not impact the project budget and we anticipate no substantive changes to the timetable of project activities.
