Depending on the outcome of this assessment a decision will be taken on whether to produce a draft Operational Plan.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.

Plans to undertake the bait trial on Gough Island during September/October 2012 were postponed due to the South African National Antarctic Programme (SANAP) undertaking the inaugural voyage of their research vessel (the Agulhas II) and due to the fact that a new helicopter company was involved in this voyage. Both the Agulhas operations and the helicopter company will need to be closely involved with the bait trial on Gough and we decided that there was less operational risk to the trial if this was postponed to 2013.

Have any of these issues been discussed with LTS International and if so, have changes been made to the original agreement?

A change request form (details below) was submitted to LTS outlining the delay in the large-scale bait trial plans for Gough Island and requesting that the project's end date be prolonged until 31 January 2014 and that there is a carry forward of funds in to 2013-2014.
