1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – Sept) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up to end September).

We have made good progress and are on schedule:

1. UK staff visited Ghana in April to liaise with project partners, discuss progress against agreed baselines and milestones, formalise plans and arrangements for Year 2, participate in biodiversity surveys and discuss arrangements for their forthcoming year in the UK with the two Darwin Research Fellows (one male, one female).

2. Fieldwork for biodiversity surveys of birds, butterflies, ants and termites in oil palm smallholdings (BAP experiment) and natural forest was all completed on schedule, together with additional surveys of fruit-feeding moths. Collection of environmental (vegetation, light and temperature) data at all biodiversity sampling sites was completed simultaneously, as was collection and analysis of soil samples.

3. Collection of data on oil palm yields (number and combined mass of fresh fruit bunches per month) was completed as planned for each of the smallholders (both men and women) in our BAP experiment.

4. The two Darwin Research Fellows each registered full-time for an MSc by Research at the University of Leeds, commencing October 2017, and made arrangements to travel to the UK at the beginning of October.
