We have made good progress and are on schedule:

- 1. Identification and cataloguing of biodiversity samples from oil palm and protected forest, chemical and physical analysis of soil samples and analysis of all field data, including smallholder fruit yields and socio-economic survey data, were all completed on schedule.
- 2. Project findings were presented at an international workshop on sustainable oil palm, held in the UK during May, including presentations by each of the two Darwin Research Fellows (Michael Sasu and Linda Ofosuhene) and project partner Winston Asante (KNUST, Ghana). A further presentation by project partner Rosemary Addico (Solidaridad West Africa) was also scheduled but she was sadly unable to obtain a visa in time.
- 3. The two Darwin Research Fellows each completed and submitted a research thesis on schedule for an MSc by Research at the University of Leeds. Independent external and internal examiners were appointed and viva-voce examinations scheduled for October (Linda) and November (Michael).
- 4. Production of further written outputs and planning of community-based dissemination events in Ghana and at RSPO Roundtable meetings all advanced on schedule.
