## 1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – Sept) against the agreed project implementation timetable (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up to end September).

The project formally started the field implementation on June 2022. Series of courtesy meetings in the local partners were conducted. The team met with the National Commission of Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) Calamianes Office in Coron. The Project Lead, R Ramilo presented the project scope and objectives to NCIP Tribal Affairs Assistant, Mr. Conrad Balbutan. All requirements for FPIC were discussed. Mr. Balbutan also assured C3PH that NCIP will help to facilitate the request for FPIC. Scheduled were also planned.

In early July and August 2022, seven (7) community meetings were conducted in Cheey, Buenavista and Decabobo in Busuanga and Coron respectively. These communities are the initial recommendations of the NCIP. The team presented the project objectives and solicited the support and issuance of pre-condition/FPIC for the project. The communities were attended by elders "Apong Dakulo", men and women of the indigenous tribes of Tagbanuas.

This September 2022, three (3- Calawit, Cheey and Turda) out of the six (6) target Indigenous Peoples' communities in Coron and Busuanga, the pre-condition consent has been secured. The other 3 IP communities (Buenavista, Malawig and Turda) expected to issue their consent and support this November 2022. Other secondary data and documents were also collected like the base-line data and information of the community and their ancestral domain plans. After securing all the 6 IP consent, the pre-condition/FPIC will be filed to NCIP for official issuance of FPIC certificate.

Meeting with the partner, University of Edinburgh was also facilitated on 27 June and 28 September 2022 to finalize the schedule and activity plan for the project. The partner representative is schedule to visit Calamianes Palawan in January 2023 to start the work on IP-social survey.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments/lessons learnt that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.			
The team experienced that there are some challenges in securing the FPIC permit from the partner communities considering the limitation on communications and transportation. The elders who are living in far and remote side of the communities are sometime difficult to reach and invite in community meetings to attain the proper quorum required to pass resolution and agreements. As one of the important requirements to fully implement the project, it needs an ample time to secure. This is manageable and no effect on the budget and timetable of the project activities.
