In the last 6 months, from late April to October, we have achieved significant progress in the execution of our project. Compared to the agreed schedule, we are meeting the established deadlines, and the work team has effectively consolidated, demonstrating excellent collaboration and coordination in the implementation of planned activities.

The monitoring and evaluation systems have been appropriate, using an Excel matrix as suggested in the resources from the Darwin Initiative website. Additionally, there is a designated person responsible for continuously carrying out these tasks, maintaining constant communication with the rest of the team, making necessary adjustments to ensure compliance with the schedule, outputs, and outcomes.

The indicators used have proven to be relevant for evaluating the expected results and measuring the project's impact, including standard indicators, those related to policies, and project-specific internal indicators.

During this period, we have been able to validate some previously formulated hypotheses through the strategic plan of the network, which was developed in a participatory manner with the members in several working sessions. As we move forward, we will continue to work on the validation of the remaining hypotheses during the second year of implementation.

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments/lessons learnt that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.

During the last 6 months, several noteworthy issues and unexpected events have come to light, along with valuable lessons learned that have impacted the project in various ways.

Institutional Schedule: One challenge encountered relates to the institutional schedules of the participating teachers. Their time restrictions, permissions granted by school principals, and school hours have posed logistical challenges. However, despite these restrictions, the project activities have been carried out according to the established timeline and budget.

Tourism Tax Increase: An important and unexpected problem emerged with the increase in the tourism tax from 12% to 19%. This has directly affected the project's budget since it is related to the airfare prices for instructors who need to travel. This unanticipated cost increase due to tax changes is impacting the project budget.

Fluctuations in Exchange Rates: The depreciation of the local currency (peso) against the US dollar has negatively affected project expenses. When the budget was initially prepared, the exchange rate was approximately \$4,900 pesos per dollar, but currently, it stands at \$4,000 pesos per dollar, resulting in reduced purchasing power and an increased cost for the project.

These unforeseen impacts have put additional strain on the project budget, forcing a reevaluation of the travel expenses. Funds from other budget items have been reallocated to address these increased costs.

Participant Numbers: Another challenge has been the lower number of participants compared to the initial target. The project aimed to train 40 teachers, but the actual average participation has been 33. To address this, an action plan is being developed to boost participation by actively reaching out to new schools, both public and private. The initial strategy to motivate registered teachers did not give the expected results, this required a more robust strategy to meet the participation objective.

Participant Attendance: Although participant attendance has been inconsistent, it hasn't affected the execution of project activities. Efforts are being made to ensure that teachers who missed some sessions have the opportunity to catch up and strengthen their capabilities across all proposed aspects.

These challenges and unexpected events are being addressed, and the team is actively working on strategies to overcome them and ensure that the project remains on track.
