1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – September) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up).

Project Officer [Dafydd Crabtree] spent a total of 12 weeks at National Museum Wales and Royal Botanic Gardens of Kew receiving training for the job as Lower Plants Project Officer (Output 1.1). This included mentoring in taxon found in the Falkland Islands and survey methods to be implemented (Output 2.4). There has been international leasing and contact with specialists and authorities of lower plants of the Sub-Antarctic regarding dissemination of results. This has included offers of help in identifying samples and collections and offers of help with field work (Output 3.2). Furthermore there has been various communications with the community such as information on the project through the Falklands Conservation Newsletter and a scheduled radio interview for the end of the month (Output 4.3 and Output 4.4). Preliminary logistics and sourcing specialists to come down to the Falkland Islands for the first scheduled field trip will be completed in the next 3 weeks. This has included synchronising each specialist's spare time, locations for field work and logistics such as travel and accommodation (Output 1.2).

2. Give details of any notable problems or unexpected developments that the project has encountered over the last 6 months. Explain what impact these could have on the project and whether the changes will affect the budget and timetable of project activities.

There was delayed freight shipping of a dissecting microscope, compound microscope and equipment sent from NMW, which slightly held back the creation of a lower plants lab. This has not affected project outputs as the first 3-4 months were used to facilitate and organise the January field expedition.
