1. Outline progress over the last 6 months (April – Sept) against the agreed baseline timetable for the project (if your project has started less than 6 months ago, please report on the period since start up to end September).

The goat eradication activities have continued over the last six months with culling taking place at three of the four project sites. A total of 91 goats have been eradicated in this reporting period, with 18 at Great Tobago National Park, 8 at Little Tobago National Park, and 65 at Prickly Pear National Park. Culling at Green Cay was due to be started in September but then the BVI experienced the category 5 hurricane Irma and project activities ceased pending recovery within the Territory.

An assessment of goat populations on all islands will take place this quarter and culling activities will continue.

Rat eradication: There are 36 A24 traps left in stock in the BVI, yet to be deployed. Site visits are going to be carried out in this quarter to assess how many A24 traps are remaining in the field post hurricane Irma. These visits have not been possible as yet due to immediate recovery efforts taking priority as a result of the devastation caused by hurricane Irma.

A second order of A24 traps is still pending as it had not been shipped yet from the supplier GoodNature in New Zealand.

From May through August monitoring took place at Green Cay and Seal Dogs game cameras were set up to capture evidence of rat presence or absence. Footage from the game cameras has been monitored and rats have been visible at Green Cay.

Specific details on these monitoring activities have been difficult to access for this half year report, as project partner Susan Zaluski of JVDPS is based in Jost Van Dyke and has poor communication ability due to the lack of electricity and internet. However more information can be provided in the coming weeks as communication improves and she can travel to Tortola to use office facilities.
