In the first six months of the project, we have made the following progress.

- 1. Purchased monitoring equipment and shipped to Anguilla. Four Automated Monitoring of Insects (AMI) sensors to be deployed on Anguilla to assess the outcomes of restoration following the eradication of invasive species.
- 2. Built an AI image classifier for Anguilla moths through collation of existing species lists for the moths of Anguilla, then running a data processing pipeline to build a machine learning model using existing labelled image data for these species (accessed via the GBIF platform)
- 3. Liaised with project partner, Anguilla National Trust, to plan an project workshop on Anguilla (28th October to 1st November 2024).
