Where we are coming from







- Projects develop their logframes in isolation from each other
- Although we can see individual project results, we struggle to combine data from across our projects to find out the shared results of our portfolio of projects
- Some applicants and projects struggle to identify the most appropriate indicators for their logframes
- In the past, we have asked projects to report against Standard Measures (e.g. number of people trained). These new Standard Indicators replace these old Standard Measures.



Where we are going, and why







- We have developed new Standard Indicators for each of the BCFs
- They are aligned with fund-level Theories of Change and programme objectives
- Through this process we want to:
 - help you to monitor your project progress and results, using globally recognised indicators
 - o provide guidance on which methodology, units and disaggregation measures to use to help you plan your monitoring and evaluation more effectively
 - increase our contribution to the global evidence base in the areas BCFs projects work
 - aggregate data from across diverse projects and communicate our combined results to key decision makers to build the case for continued support

What we want you to do









- For upcoming application rounds, applicants will be asked to include Standard Indicators in their application forms at the project design stage. They will be required to select five Core Indicators.
- We ask existing projects to map their existing indicators to these standard indicators, and report on these in their upcoming reporting. No requirement – but we are strongly encouraging it.
- Check our fund-specific "Menus" for the list of Standard Indicators to choose from.



FAQs







Who needs to use Standard Indicators?

All new applications are required to select five Core Indicators. For existing projects (like you) there is no strict requirement but it is strongly encouraged.

How many indicators need to align?

As many as you want! For existing projects, no lower or upper limits but there are more specific requirements for new projects.

Where should we report on indicators that do not map to Standard Indicators?

As in previous years, you should report on your existing indicators in the Annex 1 - "Progress against achievements in the logframe" table.

FAQs







Does this apply to projects under all funds and schemes?

Yes, there is a mix of indicators relevant to all types of projects including small projects like Darwin Initiative's Capability and Capacity, IWT Challenge Fund Evidence, and Main projects across all funds, up to the largest projects like Darwin Initiative Extra.

Do changes to indicator wording to better align with Standard indicators require a change request?

Minor changes to your indicator wording to align with Standard Indicators is allowed, but more significant changes will need to be agreed via change request. If you are not sure, please contact the BCFs team for advice.
