The DEC

- 20 members – academics, policy researchers, independent consultants, government officials
- Review and score proposals and make recommendations to DEFRA
- Contribute to Darwin strategy
- Act as ambassadors for Darwin
- Help build capacity for applications from developing countries

Proposal review process

- Review and score Stage 1 proposals against a checklist of issues (scoring criteria in Guidance; 3 reviewers per proposal)
- Discuss at a “sift” meeting to generate a shortlist for Stage 2
- Review and score Stage 2 proposals (same criteria as Stage 1)
- Discuss at a “sift” meeting to generate a list of recommended projects for DEFRA minister (subject to additional ODA eligibility screening by LTS)
